

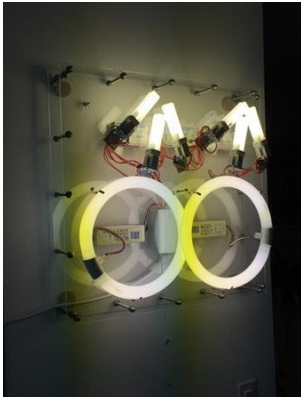

"My artwork is a component of my scientific research. I study water pollution, including the impacts of chemicals, urbanization, and anthropogenic litter (trash like plastic, glass, and metal) in streams. Litter is one part of the permanent human imprint on Earth's geologic record. To make this connection, I attach litter onto the frames of canvases with painted abstractions of geologic layers, and include a graph of data generated using the litter items."
